

Regular Council Meeting

This meeting was conducted at both 222 W. Yoakum and broadcasted on Face Book Live.

Council Members: Tony Enderle, Ron Davis, Andy Sadler, Mark Perkins, Steve Milz, Danny Finley, Tara Golightly and Eric Seyer were present.

The meeting was opened by the Mayor, Samuel Glency.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Eric Seyer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were presented to the Council. A motion made to approve the minutes by Andy Sadler and seconded by Eric Seyer. All in favor. Motion Carried.

Old business was discussed. Steve Milz asked about the ditch and if there had been any conversations with MODOT, the City Administrator said no. Steve asked about the bug machine, Lee said he has bids coming and they will be doing the best they can with their current equipment. Steve also said neighbors have been complaining about people playing in the mud pit with mowers and stuff and he would like to see the blocks moved and seeding done. The German Day Foundation was brought up in relation to the blocks and grounds, the Mayor said he'd contact Eric and Auggie about coming to a meeting. Steve said there also needs to be a gate at the grade school by Frates to stop traffic. Mark Perkins asked about the time keeping system, Lee said that the system should be good to go for the next payroll. Discussion was heard.

Fence and building permits were presented for; John R. Jenkins at 602 Sheridan Dr. for a new storage building and Wayne Held at 326 Helen for a new house. Discussion was heard. A motion was made to approve both of the building permits by Steve Milz, seconded by Ron Davis. All in favor. Motion Carried.

Chief Sullivan let the Council know that the Police Department has received an email from the Blue Shield Community about a grant, which is thought to be around \$50,000.00 and he should receive an additional email in July. Billy also said 10 day notices have been sent out. Some residents are having issues with the work done by the city on some of the ditches. The ditches are too steep for some residents to take care of them. Discussion was heard.

Assistant Fire Chief Cody was not present but the Mayor, Sam Glency supplied the Council with a 2 page draft of the quote from Motorola Solutions for \$6,512.77 and an estimate from Premier Communications for \$2,333.25 for the installation and purchase of 1 radio. Discussion was heard. A Motion to buy 1 radio and the installation of the radio, on the advice of the Assistant Fire Chief was made by Steve Milz, seconded by Tony Enderle. Questions were raised about the best use of the public works employee's time dealing with trash cans for Republic and the use of space in the building, with chemicals and equipment sitting out in the weather. Discussion was heard.

The Mayor asked the Council to address businesses operating in the City without business licenses and/or liability or workmans comp insurance, the use of side by sides, golf carts, scooters and e-bikes operating on city streets without stickers or proof of insurance and being operated by children. Discussion was heard.

The Mayor would like to have an alcohol free celebration at Frisco Park for the United States 250 year Anniversary. This celebration would take place over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July from approximately 5pm to 10pm and he'd like to include civic organizations to put up stands with no charge for the stands, a band to play, food trucks and fireworks. He would like to get donations as well as use the current public celebration budget of \$1500.00. Discussion was heard.
